#### UNVEILING THE HONOR BOARD.

On Wednesday, March 7, the ceremony of unveiling the honor board of men at the front who have attended the Glen Alvie State School, was performed by the Hon. A. Downward, M.L.A., in the presence of a large assembly of parents and friends.

The proceedings were commenced by singing the National Anthem, after which a very good concert was given; the contributors being Mrs. Hinneberg, Mrs. McKissock, Miss Bonbow, and Messrs. Hinneberg and O'Kane, Wonthaggi, and Miss Wilkinson, Kongwak. After the first part of the programme had been rendered, the chairman (Cr. W. S. Walker, J.P.), President of the Shire, introduced Mr. Downward, who unveiled the honor board. Mr. Downward gave a very interesting address on what those boys were doing for the loved ones they had left behind, as well as for those who were fit to go, but had not yet responded. He also enlarged on the cost of the war to the Empire, as well as Australia. The sooner the eligible men went to fight for their homes, the sooner the terrible war would end.

Mr. Hinneberg supplemented the previous speaker's remarks with a stirring address on patriotism.

At the conclusion of their remarks Cr. Walker moved a hearty vote of thanks to Mr. Downward and to Mr. Hinneberg for their instructive addresses. Mr. Downward was always ready to do any-
